The Campground revenue will not replace the revenue sources used in the previous years as all the previous sources of revenue will continue.



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Proposed Expansion Plan Overview - Highlights


- Increase the number of sites to approximately 95 sites over a period of a few years
- Expand towards the old Parsons Yard, away from current residences and between the current trails and River Road
- Maintain the integrity of the area between the trails and the bank towards the residents




Community Involvement

- Notices of the project and an open house were placed in the local papers and were covered by the local radio station as well as on social media.
- Flyers were delivered to approximately 135 homes in the area from 103rd Street to Ross Creek and from 101st Avenue to the top of bank highlighting the project and inviting them to the open house.
 - A total of 35 people signed in at the open house
 - 26 filled out comment cards
 - 21 indicated that they were in favour
 - 5 indicated they were against
