







#### Emergency Care

- ▶ 6 stretchers with capacity to open to 14
- ▶ 17 753 visits in 2014-15
- 42% of ED patients have conditions that are moderately severe or worse
- Average length of stay among triaged patients is 2.1 hours
- Average time of arrival to seeing a doctor 1.2 hours





#### Surgical Care

- ▶ 4 General Surgeons (1030 surgeries performed 14-15)
  - ▶ Bowel resection, appendix, gall bladder, hernia repair, colonoscopy, gastroscopy
- ▶ 4 Ophthalmologists (2009 surgeries performed 14-15)
  - ► Cataract Surgery, Strabismus Repair
- ▶ 1 Gastroenterologist
  - ► Endoscopy (2044 procedures performed 14-15)
- ▶ 1 General Practitioner with special interest in obstetrics and gynecology
  - ► C-sections (39 c-sections performed 14-15)

## Heartland Primary Care Network

- ► All of the FSCH family physicians are members of the Heartland Primary Care Network
- ► The FSCH works closely with the PCN, currently focusing on frequent visitors to the Emergency Department, and how the PCN may be able to support those patients and decrease their need for emergency care
- ► The PCN is a key stakeholder in the development of the new Women's' Health Program, and will sit on the steering committee as the program is developed



#### Fort Saskatchewan Community Hospital Foundation

- ▶ Volunteer board was established in 2008
- First campaign supporting the CT scanner was a major success
- Support staff education by providing annual scholarships to staff pursuing advanced education
- Surgical Equipment Campaign in 2015 saw
   \$ 250 000 of new equipment purchased for the OR
- ► Two exciting new proposals currently under review
